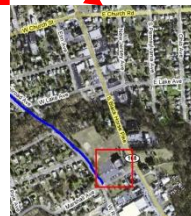
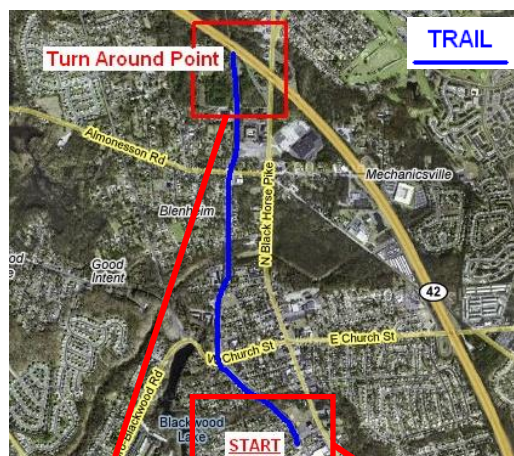

What Is Sarcoma?

Sarcoma is a term used to describe a whole family of cancers that arise in the body's connective tissues, which include fat, muscle, blood vessels, deep skin tissue, nerves, bones, and cartilage. Sarcomas are divided into two main groups; bone tumors and soft tissue sarcomas. They are further sub-classified based on the type of cell found in the tumor. They all share certain microscopic characteristics and have similar symptoms. Sarcomas can develop in children and adults.
