Sarcoma does not discriminate by age, gender, or race. As a rare diagnosis, this is a community who has special needs and requires special attention. Survival depends upon it. The Sarcoma Alliance is working to address the needs of this special community and to get sarcoma patients the necessary resources and attention they deserve.

The Sarcoma Alliance is striving to extend and improve the lives of sarcoma patients through accurate diagnosis, improved access to care, education and support. Together we can make a difference.

All services provided by the Sarcoma Alliance are provided free of charge.

Guidance: A sarcoma diagnosis can be distressing and confusing. As sarcoma survivors, the Sarcoma Alliance can help guide patients and their loved ones through the complex maze of medical providers, treatment options, and information sources available to them.

Education: Few people know the ins and outs of cancer symptoms, diagnosis, treatment, and clinical research before they find out they have a sarcoma. The Sarcoma Alliance can bring patients up to speed on the basics, refer them to authoritative publications and websites for further study, and help patients get plugged into the various support networks already established for adults and children with sarcoma.

Support: It can be a lonely experience finding out you have a sarcoma. The Sarcoma Alliance can link patients up with other people facing similar challenges. The Sarcoma Alliance believes that the most successful patients are educated and connected to others for social support. What is Sarcoma?

Malignant (cancerous) tumors of the connective tissues are called "sarcomas". Although rare, there are approximately 9,800 new cases of sarcoma each year in the United States. The term sarcoma comes from a Greek word meaning fleshy growth. Sarcoma arises in the connective tissue of the body. Normal connective tissue include, fat, blood vessels, nerves, bones, muscles, deep skin tissues, and cartilage. Sarcomas are divided into two main groups, bone tumors and soft tissue sarcomas. They are further sub-classified based on the type of cell found in the tumor. They all share certain microscopic characteristics and have similar symptoms. Sarcomas can develop in children and adults.
