Sarcoma is a rare and aggressive cancer of the connective tissues.

SARCOMA FACTS



Connective tissues (bone, muscle, fat, etc.) support or surround other structures throughout the body, which means that sarcomas can occur in any location.



Each year, approximately 17,000 people in the U.S. are diagnosed with sarcoma.



Sarcoma occurs in people of all ages and backgrounds. Although it represents only about 1% of adult cancers, sarcoma accounts for approximately 15% of all pediatric cancers.



The cause of most sarcomas is unknown. It is not associated with smoking, obesity, diet or alcohol intake. For a small percentage of sarcomas, there are some genetic risk factors.



There are more than 100 identified types of sarcoma—each with unique behavior and treatment approaches.




Depending on the type of sarcoma, surgery, radiation and/or chemotherapy may be recommended treatments.



It is very important for sarcoma patients to be seen by providers with expertise in the diagnosis and treatment of the disease.
